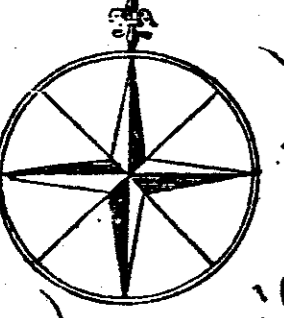


This Map of KENTUCKE,
